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Introduction

Welcome parents and children to Pre-primary at Subiaco Primary School. This booklet is to inform you about the Pre-primary year of schooling. During this year, we will provide your child with the opportunity to develop foundational skills and knowledge they will build on throughout their future education. Our role as early childhood educators, is to provide your child with the best possible start to their education.

The Pre-primary Program features a holistic, integrated approach where child-centred activities, play, open-ended tasks, explicit teaching and targeted, structured activities contribute to a balanced curriculum. We believe that every student is an individual and we strive to plan and support each student to work at their individual developmental level – that includes catering for children’s cognitive, social, behavioural, emotional and physical needs.

We recognise that play is particularly important in the early childhood years. Play provides children with opportunities to practise skills, communicate with others, take on challenges and solve real life problems in fun and enjoyable ways. Play-based learning aligned with explicit teaching is an integral and central part of our Pre-primary program.

Your child and family are very important members of our school community.

National Quality Standard

The Australian Government has recognised the importance of increasing the focus on the early years to ensure the well-being of children throughout their lives and to lift the productivity of our nation. The drive for change is based on clear evidence that the early years are very important for present and future health, development and well-being. A National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care has been developed. This sets the National Quality Standard (NQS) that all early childhood programs, including schools from Years K to 2, must meet. There are 7 quality areas: educational program and practice, physical environment, children’s health & safety, relationships, collaborative partnerships with families and communities, staffing, and leadership.

Beginning Pre-primary

Avoiding the last minute rush

**All Pre-primary sessions commence at 8.50am.
Doors open at 8.30am.**

Parents are warmly invited to wait with their children outside the classroom each morning until the doors open at 8:30. To ensure a calm and safe start to the day, the playground and outdoor equipment will be closed before school. We encourage our students to build independence by placing their water bottles in the allocated areas and bringing in their folders or news items themselves.

For safety, children should always be accompanied by a parent/guardian and handed directly to a staff member when entering the Pre-primary classroom. Establishing a consistent morning routine and allowing plenty of time for arrival helps your child feel settled and ready for learning. Arriving on time ensures your child can join in smoothly with the class and be part of important early learning activities.

Saying Goodbye

Once you have assisted your child to unpack their water bottle and completed their morning routines, encourage your child to greet their teacher upon entering their classroom before finding a table activity which they would like to participate in. Parents are welcome to sit and interact with their child during this time.

The classroom teacher will ring a bell signalling the start of their teaching sessions. Please take the time to say goodbye to your child and to remind them of who will be collecting them at the end of their day. Teachers and Education Assistants will be on hand to help reassure and to comfort students who may need some support during this separation period.

Picking Up Children

The Pre-primary session concludes at 3:10pm.

All students are to be collected from their classrooms by an authorised adult. Parents are asked to wait outside the classroom door until your child is released by a member of staff. This is important to ensure that all students are accounted for and are safely collected. If there are changes to your pick up arrangements or you are running late to collect your child, please contact the front office so that your child and their teacher can be informed. Students who are not collected by 3.20pm will need to be collected from the front office in accordance with our school policy.





Healthy Eating

Recess, Lunch and Crunch and Sip are important parts of our daily routines and provide your child with the opportunity to re-fuel whilst engaging in social opportunities and interactions with their teachers and their peers. Our school is a Healthy Eating School and we encourage packing fruit, vegetables and healthy lunch items for your child. At recess, students are required to bring an individual healthy snack, such as fruit. They may also bring healthy alternatives such as dried fruits, cheese, rice crackers or vegetable sticks. Your child will also need to bring a packed lunch in a labelled container. Ensure that your child can manage food wrappings and open containers, lunch boxes and drink bottles independently. Please distinguish between lunch, recess and crunch & sip with your child.

Birthdays

We are very happy to celebrate birthday's in Pre-primary and you are welcome to bring individual cup cakes to share on your child's birthday. When catering for the class, remember there will be up to 27 serves required and check with staff if there are any allergies or cultural needs to be considered. Please keep portions small.

Looking after belongings

Children should not bring in any toys or personal, precious items to school unless they have been requested for a particular reason (e.g. news telling). Please check with the class teacher if you are unsure. Precious items from home can be accidentally damaged, broken or lost which can be very distressing to the child concerned and staff can not take responsibility for lost or damaged items.

Please label all of your child's belongings and show them where these labels have been placed.

Making Friends

Your child will make lots of new friends at school.

As they go from one year to the next, they are likely to have different children in their classes.

Making friends is one of the most important social skills children learn at school. You can encourage this by:

- chatting with your child about how they talk with other children
- getting your child to share
- teaching your child to listen to others
- teaching your child to say 'please' and 'thank you'.

Often children have so much fun at school that they want to have more fun after school. They may ask to have a play date. This is a great way for you to get to know your child's friends and their parents. Meet at a park or play at each other's homes.



Practical Matters

Communication between home and school

Pre-primary teachers use the SeeSaw app to communicate with parents about upcoming classroom events, as well as to share photos and/or videos of your students engaged in their learning throughout the day. At the beginning of the year, you will be provided with a SeeSaw consent form to complete which is to be returned to your class teacher. Upon receiving this you will be sent an invitation with instructions for logging in and connecting with your child's learning. Please note that only parents/guardians will have access to and can see their own child's digital portfolio. Notices will also be displayed outside your child's classroom. Parents of separated families are encouraged to agree on methods of communication between home and school so that everyone can be included.

Compass is a communication tool that facilitates interaction between the school and parents. For further information on Compass please read Page 13.

What to bring to Pre-primary

All Pre-primary students are required to bring a Subiaco Primary School bag to school each day which contains sunscreen, a change of clothes and a packet of wet wipes inside of a large zip lock bag, in case of any accidents at school. Your child is also asked to bring a clearly labelled water bottle (no drinks other than water) with them to school each day. Please inform your child's teacher if you forget to bring this so an alternative option can be provided for them.

On the first day of Pre-primary, stationery items, as listed on the Personal Items List, are to be brought to school and handed to your child's teacher. Please note that items such as scrapbooks, clipboards, whiteboards, document wallets and display books need to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Contact details

The safety of all students and staff is paramount. In case of an emergency, it is important that the school has your current contact details. Details can be updated via Compass or email the school subiaco.ps@education.wa.edu.au

Attendance

Pre-primary is compulsory full-time schooling.

Once enrolled, it is important that children develop regular attendance habits.

Teachers plan learning programs sequentially, so when children don't attend school regularly, they miss out on important information, learning and skills. Children who are regularly absent risk missing out on the basic building blocks in core learning areas.

If your child is absent from school, please notify the school via Compass, our website, by phone, or email - subiaco.ps@education.wa.edu.au. If your child is absent from school without parental notification, we will contact you to ascertain the reason.

Please make allied health appointments outside of school hours.

Travelling to and from school

Students are encouraged to ride scooters and bicycles to school with parents but are not permitted to ride them within the school boundaries. All students are required to dismount and walk their bike/ scooter through the school grounds and secure it at the bike/scooter racks during school hours.

The school is not responsible for the safe keeping of bikes/scooters; an appropriate locking device is recommended.

Excursions

Students may be taken on excursions throughout the year. A notification will be sent via Compass to caregivers prior to the excursion with an online permission form for you to complete. This form must be completed prior to the excursion, otherwise arrangements will be made for your child to remain at school.

Children leaving the school grounds will always be accompanied by the appropriate number of adults as specified in the Department of Education's Excursion Policy. Parents may also be asked to attend excursions to help with the supervision of children.

Please refer to the information provided on Compass regarding what students will be required to take with them. All Pre-primary students will be expected to wear their uniform when leaving the school grounds.

Uniforms

The School Board endorses the wearing of the school uniform.

All students are also to bring a broad brimmed hat which is to be worn during all outdoor based activities, including recess, lunch and Physical Education sessions. Our school is an accredited SunSmart school and we strive to ensure that all students, staff, parents and visitors are made aware of the risks of sun damage and are provided with the opportunity to protect themselves at all appropriate times.

In line with the recommendations from the Cancer Council of WA, our school has adopted the 'no hat-play in the shade' policy.

Voluntary contributions

The Subiaco Primary School Board endorses the schedule of Contributions and Charges each year. The schedule allows you to calculate all costs that may be incurred throughout the year. The cost outlined is the maximum that the school will not exceed.

The P&C also ask that you support the school by paying their annual voluntary contribution. The Subiaco Primary School community are involved in a number of fundraising activities which require your ongoing support.

Swimming Lessons

- Location - Subiaco Primary School Pool

Support for students

Government schools are for all children. Diversity among students and their families is recognised and welcomed. All school staff are committed to working with you to provide every possible assistance and support for the wellbeing of your child.

Subiaco Primary School engages the experience of the 'School Health Services' each year for all Pre-primary students

School Health Service's role is to work with children, caregivers and classroom teachers for the early detection of physical and psychosocial health and development issues which may impede health, wellbeing and school achievement. Care provided to individual children and their families may entail an assessment, brief intervention, health information, referral, monitoring and support.

If you would like any further information regarding support services, ask your Pre-primary teacher for advice.

On-Entry Testing

In Term One, your child will be participating in the state-wide On Entry Assessment Program. During this time, your child's skills are individually assessed in literacy and numeracy. The teacher will use this information to plan and target teaching programs to suit each child's learning needs. It is important that your child continues to build on necessary skills developed at home to progress through school. Your child's results will be provided to you during a parent/teacher interview at the end of Term One.

Information and Communication Technology

At Subiaco Primary School, digital technology is thoughtfully integrated across all aspects of teaching and learning. Students engage with age-appropriate digital tools to support creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking. A Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) iPad program prepares students in Years 4 to 6 for transition to high school. Teachers use digital platforms to monitor student progress, personalise learning, and collaborate on curriculum planning. The school also prioritises online safety, offering resources such as the Online Safety Hub and after hours cyber safe seminars, to support families. Through a balanced approach, Subiaco Primary fosters digital literacy while ensuring students develop the skills needed to thrive in a connected world.

Outside School Hours Care

TheirCare OSHC offers before and after school care on school grounds. They are highly focused on child well-being and development, and on delivering the best quality care for our community.

Health and Medical Information

If your child is sick at school

Children who are ill must not attend school. A child who is not well can become very distressed when in a group situation. If your child is unwell or you think they are becoming unwell, please keep them at home, as we have other children and teaching staff who can subsequently become ill. If your child becomes ill or is injured at school, we will contact you and administer first aid if required. You will be asked to collect your child if they are too sick to remain in class. For this reason, it is important to keep your contact details current.

Immunisation

Children enrolling in Pre-primary must be up to date with all the scheduled immunisations for their age to be able to attend school. You are required on enrolment to show your child's Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) and their immunisation History Statement as proof.

From Pre-primary onwards, if an outbreak of an infectious disease occurs at the school, parents of children who do not have an up to date immunisation status will be asked to keep them at home, until the danger has passed. You can check your child's immunisation status online: www.medicareaustralia.gov.au/public/online-services/

Allergies and Medical conditions

If your child has a medical condition (allergies, asthma, epilepsy, diabetes etc) please inform the teacher and the front office.

All children with a significant medical condition or illness will have a Medical Action Plan which provides staff with directions which can be easily followed, based on the medical advice provided from your child's doctor. This plan will be updated each year or as the need arises. Staff need to be made aware of all levels of allergic conditions including food, grass, animals etc.

If your child has an allergy, you must advise the school and provide them with a copy of your child's Allergy Action Plan, which has been developed by your doctor. All allergy medication and EpiPens are required to be clearly labelled with your child's name and not be expired.



Medication

We understand that, at times, your child may need to have medication during the day and whilst it is preferable for parents to administer them, we are able to do so when you have given us adequate information and signed an Administration of Medication Request Form. The medication should be handed to the teacher or front office and not left in student backpacks.

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Getting Involved

Children love to see their parents and carers at their school. Research shows that students perform better at school when their caregivers take an active interest in their schooling. Your contribution to the school is needed and valued.

Rosters are displayed on our notice boards and we encourage you to be involved. The children get a great deal of pleasure and pride when you come to a Pre-primary session and it is a valuable opportunity for you to see how your child is developing and growing in a school setting.

P&C

The Parents & Citizens Association is a group of parent and carer volunteers who work closely with the school to enhance the school community and assist in the provision of resources for the benefit of children at the school.

P&C meetings are usually held on the Monday of Weeks 5 and 9 of every term in the School Library at 7:00pm.

School Board

Subiaco Primary School is an Independent Public School. Independent Public Schools set their own strategic directions, have authority for day-to-day decision making and are in an ideal position to make decisions that best cater for their students. Parents and community members have an important and enhanced role in this initiative through the School Board.

The School Board meets twice a term. Details of our current Board members are available on the school website. Notice of the upcoming elections to the School Board will be indicated in the school newsletter and on the school website.

Communication

At Subiaco Primary School we endeavour to communicate regularly regarding your child's progress and to inform you of upcoming events. Please email your class teacher on matters concerning your child or to arrange a meeting time to discuss further. Parent-teacher interviews offer a formal opportunity to speak with your child's teacher about your child's progress. If you still feel you need further assistance, please contact the school office and request an appointment to speak with a member of the school executive team.

Please notify your classroom teacher at morning drop off if there are any changes to your regular home routine, such as a late night, Fly in Fly out parents leaving/returning, or any other worries. As previously mentioned, please also make it a habit to check notices displayed outside your child's classroom and on the See-Saw app.

Curriculum Letter

At the beginning of each term, a curriculum letter will be distributed to parents via Compass outlining our teaching focuses. Special dates and events are also listed on this letter and it is a good idea to display this in a safe place in your home to refer to as needed.

COMPASS App

You can download the Compass App on iOS and Android devices, simply search for Compass School Manager in the store

Using the app you can:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Communicate with your teachers
- Update your family contact details
- View school and class news feed
- View the school calendar and school documentation
- Download and view your child's school reports
- Provide consent and payment for excursions ('Event')
- Pay contribution and other activity charges
- Book parent-teacher conference

School Newsletters

The school newsletter is produced fortnightly and is published on Compass and school website. The newsletter contains important information and dates relevant to our school.

Parent - Teacher Interviews

Parent- teacher interviews offer a formal opportunity to speak with your child's teacher about your child's progress.

If you have questions about your child at school at any time, please speak to your child's teacher as soon as possible. You can contact the teacher through Compass or email for an appointment.

Parent Concerns

If you have any concerns about your child's education, you should raise them with your child's teacher. If you still feel you need further assistance, contact the school office and request an appointment to speak with a member of the school executive.

Handwriting Style

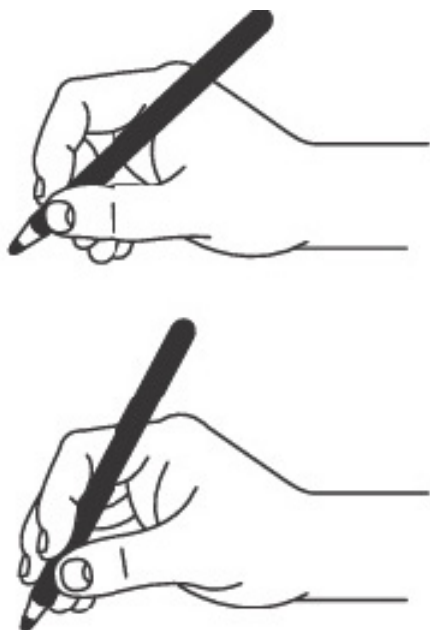


Figure 1: Acceptable pencil grips.

A pencil grip is only a problem if a child has difficulty writing legibly, at a reasonable speed, or complains of a sore or tired hand when writing.

If an awkward grip pattern becomes a habit it is more difficult to change later. Pencil grips are easier to change in kinder and the early school years.

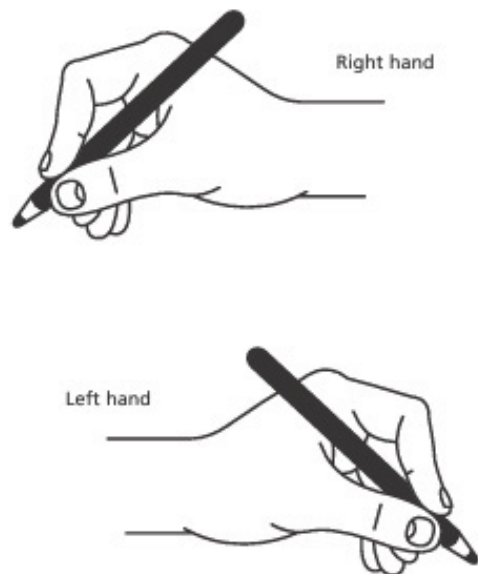


Figure 2: A good pencil grip.

Encourage your child to hold her pencil in a way that allows her hand and fingers to move freely and easily when writing or drawing. General guidelines for a good pencil grip, as shown in figure 2, include:

- ▶ the pencil is held in a stable position between the thumb, index and middle fingers
- ▶ the ring and little fingers are bent and rest comfortably on the table
- ▶ the index finger and thumb form an open space
- ▶ the wrist is bent back slightly, and the forearm is resting on the table
- ▶ the pencil is held about 1–2 cm from the tip.

My Day at Pre-primary

Time	Activities
8.30–8.50	<u>Family Time:</u> Carry out daily routines such as putting bags on outside bag racks and unpacking water bottles and crunch and sip. Answer the question of the day. Enter the classroom and greet your Teacher and Education Assistant. Children wash their hands before participating in tabletop activities designed by the teacher. These could include fine-motor activities, puzzles, name writing and games.
8.50–9.00	<u>Say Goodbye to Families:</u> Whole class mat session—role call, songs, poems, and classroom routines
9.00–10.40	<u>Literacy Mat Session/Learning:</u> Intentional teaching incorporating Heggerty and phonics-based programs; Teacher and Education Assistant led educational experiences with opportunities for play-based learning
10.40–10.50	<u>Morning Recess</u> Students sit with their Pre-primary peers to eat their recess (fruit, popcorn, crackers) provided from home in a separate container
10.50–11.20	<u>Outdoor Play/Exploration:</u> A range of experiences and skills are carefully planned to ensure children are challenged and motivated. Creative, social, cognitive and physical development are all considered in our outdoor plan.
11.20–12.55	<u>Numeracy Mat Session/Learning:</u> Intentional teaching incorporating targeted daily reviews; Teacher and Education Assistant led educational experiences with opportunities for play-based learning
12.55–1.10	<u>Lunch</u> Students sit with their Pre-primary peers to eat their lunch provided from home in a separate container
1.10–1.40	<u>Outdoor Play/Exploration:</u> A range of experiences and skills are carefully planned to ensure children are challenged and motivated. Creative, social, cognitive and physical development are all considered in our outdoor plan.
1.40–2.40	<u>Integrated Learning Program:</u> News telling/oral language, mindfulness, music and other whole class experiences
2.30–3.00	<u>Crunch and Sip/Story time</u> Crunch and sip (fruit/vegetables brought in from home in separate container) and teacher led story, pack up classroom for the day
3.10	<u>Home Time</u> Students to be collected by someone over the age of 18

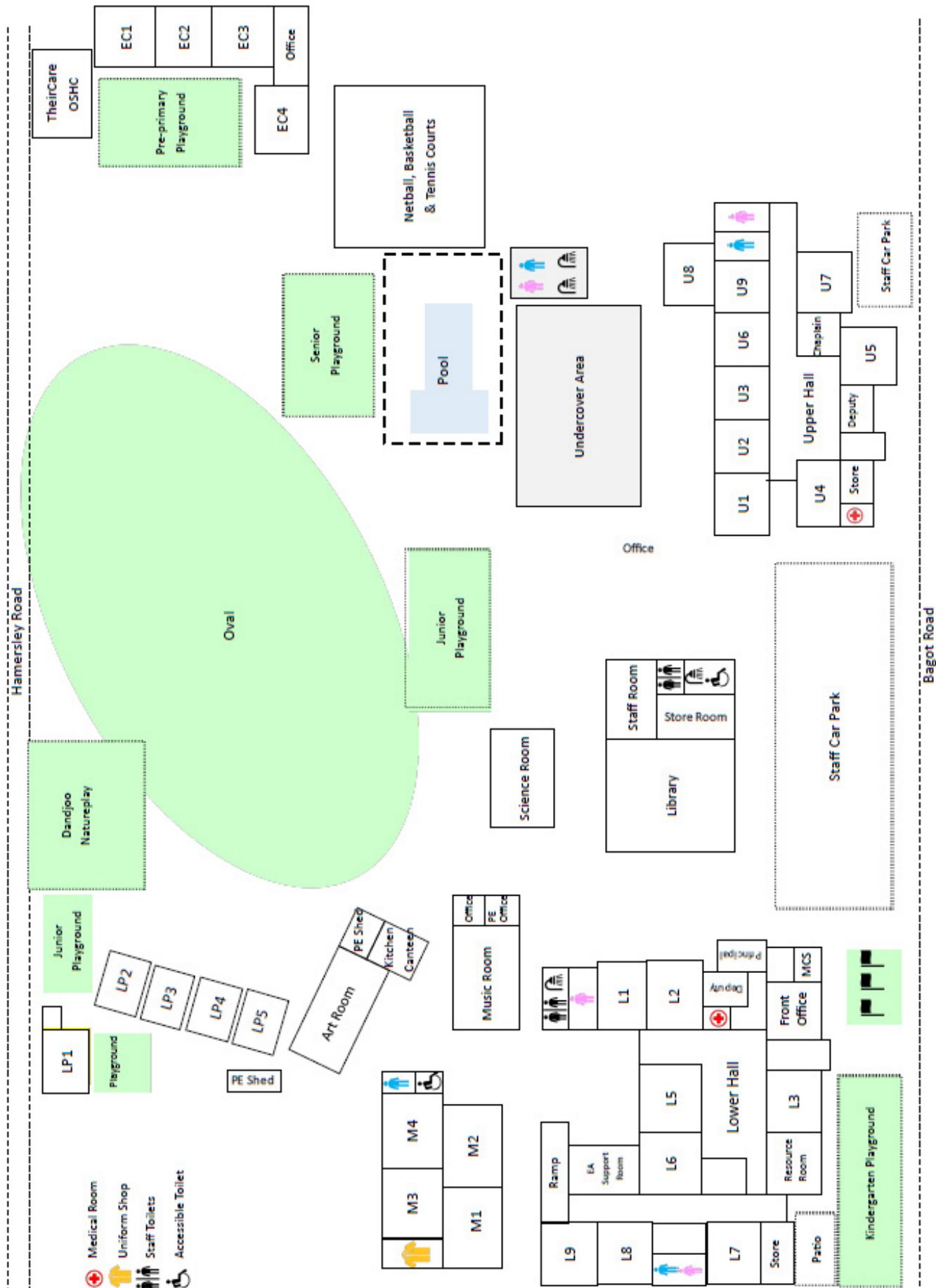

What is the Subiaco Primary P&C?
